AMENDING THE FY 2019-2022 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, NEW CASTLE COUNTY ELEMENT

WHEREAS, the Wilmington Area Planning Council (WILMAPCO) has been designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization for Cecil County, Maryland and New Castle County, Delaware by the Governors of Maryland and Delaware, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation's (USDOT) Regulations of Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST), Metropolitan Planning Requirements, require that, in air quality non-attainment areas, the MPO, in cooperation with participants in the planning process, develop and, at least every four years, updates the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and

WHEREAS, the WILMAPCO TIP format incorporates a four-year period for the listing of priority projects to be implemented, as well as a list of program development projects; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to the FY 2019-2022 TIP has undergone appropriate community and technical reviews; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to the TIP has been determined to be air quality conforming in accordance with FAST and Clean Air Act and Amendments (CAAA) of 1990 requirements; and;

WHEREAS, the amendment to the FY 2019-2022 TIP have been found to be financially constrained, as directed by 23 CFR 450.326, and consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Wilmington Area Planning Council does hereby amend the FY 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program to include revised funding for the SR 299: SR 1 – Catherine Street project.

The design now includes pedestrian facilities the entire length of the project. A sidewalk on the north side was previously included but a 10-ft multiuse path was added along the south side as a result of the first workshop.

Comment further on the quantity and quality of the public participation:

The project officially conducted one live workshop at Brick Mill Elementary school on December 2, 2015. The project was presented to the public a second time on April 8, 2019. This time at the request of New Castle County for their initial Middletown Library public workshop. The proposed library is located on the eastern edge of the project limits at the corner of Catherine St and SR299. The SR299 project will be constructing a shared storm water management pond on the library site to address portions of the SR299 project runoff and the new Middletown library site.

Much of the public involvement since September 2017 for the project has been with individual property owners and representatives of properties adjacent to the project for Real Estate purposes. The design team assists

the Real Estate staff in the acquisition process and are able to answer project related question and evaluate property owner requests for minor design adjustments.
