goals for equity and climate

- Transportation electrification
 - Reduces vehicle emissions
 - Improves Air Quality
- •Safe, reliable mobility choices and goods movement choices
 - Reduces travel emissions
 - Expands affordable access to opportunities
 - Improves sustainability of supply chains
- •Opportunities for community engagement and planning

transportation equity and climate work

- Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (11/2021)
- Inflation Reduction Act (8/2022)
- •Biden Administration work

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

(aka the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law)

Funding to over 350 distinct programs across more than a dozen federal departments and agencies.

Includes programs for broadband, roadways, transit, rail, school buses, ferries, drinking water, lead service lines, ports, energy infrastructure, EV charging, resilience/natural infrastructure

Eligibility for States, MPOs, cities, counties, tribes

Majority of funding is "advance appropriated" or funded through trust funds – not contingent on annual appropriations.

IIJA – transportation equity discretionary grant programs

Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program

• \$1 billion - Grants to remove, retrofit, or mitigate transportation facilities that create barriers to community connectivity. Includes planning and capital grants.

•RAISE Grant Program

 \$7.5 billion – Grants for projects to modernize roads, bridges, transit, rail, ports, and intermodal transportation and make our transportation systems safer, more accessible, affordable, and sustainable.

IIJA – transportation equity discretionary grant programs con't

•Charging and Fueling Infrastructure grants

 \$2.5 billion i-n grants for the deployment of EV/alt fuel infrastructure along designated highways and in communities.

Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program

- Funding to build active transportation networks and spines.
- Omnibus included \$45 million for FY23

Safe Streets and Roads for All

 \$5 billion - Planning grants to support local initiatives to prevent traffic fatalities and serious injuries.

IIJA –other transportation discretionary grant programs

The Bridge Investment Program

• \$12.5 billion - grants to for projects to replace or repair bridges and culverts.

PROTECT discretionary grants

• \$1.4 billion –grants to improve the resilience of highway infrastructure, evacuation routes, and at-risk coastal infrastructure.

Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program

 \$350 million for projects to reduce wildlife-vehicle collisions and improve habitat connectivity.

IIJA –other transportation discretionary grant programs con't

Rural Grant Program

 \$2 billion for transportation projects in rural areas (areas with population of less than 200k)

Mega Grant Program

• \$7.5 billion for large, complex projects that are difficult to fund by other means and likely to generate national or regional economic, mobility, or safety benefits.

INFRA Grant program

 \$8 billion for multimodal freight and highway projects of national or regional significance.

IIJA – Formula Dollars

Expanded Key Existing Programs

•Surface Transportation Block Grant - \$ 59.5 million for DE in FY23

• Transportation Alternatives Program: 10% set-aside from STBG

•Highway Safety Improvement Program \$12.6 million for DE in FY23

New Programs

•PROTECT formula dollars \$6 million for DE in FY23

•Carbon Reduction Program \$5.3 million for DE in FY23

•NEVI EV Charging program \$2.6 million for DE in FY23

Inflation Reduction Act

Neighborhood Access and Equity Grant Program (USDOT)

- \$3.2 billion for competitive grants
- States, local governments, Tribal governments, Territories and MPOs
- Projects to improve transportation equity and accessibility and mitigate environmental impacts from transportation facilities.
- Set-aside for disadvantaged communities

Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund/ "Climate Bank" (EPA)

- \$29 billion in funding to help nonprofits, states and other institutions use federal dollars to leverage private investments in projects that combat climate change.
- 40 % set-aside for clean energy financing in low income and disadvantaged communities

Inflation Reduction Act con't

Environmental and Climate Justice Block Grants (EPA)

- \$3 billion in competitive 3-year grants to states, tribes and municipalities and a community-based nonprofit organization
- Funds for financial and technical assistances to address clean air and climate pollution in disadvantaged communities.

Reducing Air Pollution in Fenceline Communities (EPA)

- \$3 billion for the purchase or installation of zero-emissions port equipment and technology and the development of climate action plans to reduce air pollutants at ports.
- \$1 billion for grants and rebates to help replace polluting heavy-duty vehicles with zero-emitting ones.

Clean Air and Climate Grants (EPA)

- \$389 million in funding for grants to update our aging air pollution monitoring network,
- Includes \$50 million for low-income and disadvantaged schools to reduce air pollution at the schools.

Biden Administration

Justice40 Initiative

Executive Order 14008 created the Justice40 Initiative to confront and address decades of underinvestment in disadvantaged communities.

Creates a goal that goal that 40 percent of the overall benefits of federal investments in climate and clean energy flow to disadvantaged communities

Interim guidance released July 2021.

FHWA policy memo on using BIL resources to build a better America

identifies several goals, including promoting equity in transportation investments, reconnecting communities and including disadvantaged and under-represented groups in the planning, project selection and design process
