Bridge 1-159, James St Bridge over Christina River (From Peter Haag)

One of the follow-up items from the Newport Monitoring meeting pertained to the bridge project for Bridge 1-159, James St Bridge over Christina River. Below is information I received from the Bridge Section about the project:

> The James Street bridge replacement project is approximately 60% complete. Please see attached drone image. Construction continues on the south side of the Christina River with Pier 1 and Abutment A drilled shafts (substructure of the bridge). For the completed Piers and Abutment B, the Contractor will continue with deck work (superstructure) of Spans 3 – 5 over the river. Deck work is weather-dependent and could be effected by the prevalent temperatures during colder winter months.

> Ongoing work requires single lane closures on James Street almost on a daily basis due to the space limitations and staging necessary equipment for the construction. DelDOT will continue to issue notification on a weekly basis for likely lane closures, and press releases for any planned full road closures with posted detours. 

Purpose and Need

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
- Existing Conditions:
 - Access to United Refrigeration is from Sears Boulevard and access to Highline Warren (Crowell Associates LLC) is through the Pleasant Hills Estates and Silview communities.
- Project Purpose:
 - To significantly reduce truck traffic traveling through the Pleasant Hills Estates and Silview communities, who access Highline Warren, by providing an alternative connection to Sears Boulevard.











- Two 11' Travel lanes.
- · 2' Shoulders on each side.
- Provides access from Highline Warren (Crowell Associates LLC) to Sears Boulevard only. No connection to Crowell Road.
- Additional space along turns to allow over runs by trucks.
- Proposed fence installed to separate new access road from existing property.
- Two access control gates are proposed at the current cul-de-sac and the new access point with Highline (Crowell Associates LLC).








Boxwood Road



Stanton Road Crosswalk

- Newport Monitoring Committee area served by
 - Route 5: 20 minutes weekday; 30 minutes Saturday; 60 minutes Sunday
 - Route 9: 60 minutes weekday; 90 minutes Saturday; no service on Sunday
- Total ridership within the area 303 boards and 337 offs per weekday





DART: Service Updates


- (43) Stops within the Newport Monitoring Committee area

 - Boxwood at Augustine 75 boards
 - SR 4 @ Glenmore- 40 boards

 - (2) Stops with just benches: SR 4 at Marshall St, and SR 4 at Hershey Run






The Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)

- Update due March 2023




