2016 to Present

- 1050 Students have completed the course.
- Of the approximate 2,500 Tractor-Trailer training facilities in the U.S.; only 48 schools have been certified by PTDI.
- PTDI is our accrediting agency and audits our program every five years, to ensure we are providing our students with prescribed standards and curriculum.

2016 to Present

- Students are required to receive a minimum of 104 hours of classroom training and at least 44 hours of behind-the-wheel training.
- Our current program provides students with 138 hours of classroom training and 51 hours of behind-the-wheel instruction. In addition, students are able to observe their classmates for 124 hours.
- The total hours of training received is 313 hours, and can be completed in as few as 7 weeks.
- To date: More than 800 students have completed the program with a Class "A" CDL and PTDI Certificate.
- Eight Instructors staff the department; and have a combined total of more than 275 years of instruction/driving experience.
- Student/Instructor Ratio:

 - Classroom 24:1
