Project Area

- Sycamore St. Pennsylvania Ave.
- ~ 80' right-of-way / ~ 55' curb to curb

Current Corridor Configuration

- One Way Southbound with 2 travel lanes
- Southbound bike lane on the left side transitions to sharrows at Maple Street
- 8 bus stops
- Varying sidewalk widths
- On-street parking (parallel and diagonal)
- Overhead utilities and utility cabinets
- Planters, signs, benches, garbage cans
