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Summary of Results Background

WILMAPCO, the Wilmington Area Planning Council (WILMAPCO) is the regional transportation planning agency for New Castle County, Delaware and Cecil County, Maryland, and plans and coordinates transportation investment for the region.

To provide input from the communities it serves, WILMAPCO has commissioned a survey of residents approximately every 4 years, beginning in 2006. This report provides results from the 2021/22 wave of the survey, conducted with 600 residents by the firm Telepoll in late 2021 and early 2022.



Key Findings

Resident Perceptions about Transportation

Overall, the transportation system meets the travel needs or residents. About three quarters feel the system meets their needs very or somewhat well. These results are similar in both counties, and consistent with ratings from 2014 and earlier, although they are down from the 2017 wave. Figure 1 below, and Table 145).

In keeping with overall results, effectiveness of the system for users of various modes of transportation is lower for this wave relative to 2017. What has remained consistent is the relatively higher perceptions of New Castle County residents compared to those in Cecil County. For pedestrians and cyclists, the difference is small, but for train and bus users, the gap is substantial. Note, for 2022, respondents were asked about trains and buses separately, whereas in 2017 they were asked about 'Public Transportation' as a whole. (Figure 2 and starting at Table 7)

Transportation Planning and Funding




Figure 3: Agreement with statements on Transportation Planning

Awareness of the transportation planning process has improved against 2017 results, with a higher proportion claiming awareness of the project selection process and familiarity with long-range regional plan. A similar number (19%) are familiar with TIP. (Figure 3 and Table 104)





Figure 4: Most Effective Long-Term Solution to Reduce Traffic Congestion

Improving public transit and technological improvements such as better signal timing are the most popular solutions to reducing traffic congestion, as they were in 2017. Creating communities less reliant on driving gained in popularity, while encouraging things like car pooling were less likely to be supported. (Figure 4 and Table 17)

Percent selecting each solution (excl. Don't know) (Q.10)


Among the suggested transportation issues to be addressed, a majority of respondents felt that it is essential or important to address nearly all of them.

Access to public transit and preserving farmland and open spaces were seen as important or essential by nearly all respondents (92% and 84% respectively) in both counties. While other issues enjoyed strong support, New Castle residents tended to find the other issues more worthy of being addressed. The only issue to receive less than majority support is supporting infrastructure for self-driving vehicles (Figure 5, Table 146, Table 67)

Top priorities for funding have remained relatively stable since the last wave of research. Improving the system with technology, and maintaining and repairing the existing system are more likely to be selected as high priority compared to building more roads, or providing more transit, walking or biking options. (Figure 6, Table 46)

To fund transportation initiatives, respondents were most likely to favor new fees applied to developers and others who benefit when the system is improved, and delaying or eliminating projects. Broadly applied costs for residents, such as raising transit fares, fuel taxes and licensing fees were least popular. New options, such as raising tolls or taxing drivers based on milage were not supported by the majority. (Figure 7, Table 148)

Transportation Mode Choices




Figure 8: Percent of Respondents "Ever" Using Each Mode of Transportation

Usage of most modes of transportation has been stable over the past few years, with driving alone being the most common. Incidence of walking has risen significantly, with nearly as many reporting walking as driving alone. Biking has increased in popularity too, but this difference has come entirely from New Castle County. Services such as public transit and taxi/ride sharing, which require urban density, are more likely to be used in the more populous New Castle County too. (Figure 8 and Table 19)

Air Quality

Awareness of the Air Quality Partnership of Delaware has increased among New Castle County residents to 23%, from 17% in 2017.




Figure 9: Actions willing to take to improve regional air quality

Respondents from across the region expressed a willingness to take a range of actions to help improve the air quality. Switching from gas to electric tools and appliances, and refueling vehicles at certain times were the most popular actions, followed by walking or taking transit. (Figure 9 and Table 96)

Familiarity with WILMAPCO

Familiarity with WILMAPCO, the Wilmington Area Planning Council, is consistent with previous waves of this research. Residents of New Castle County are slightly more likely to state they are familiar. (Figure 10 and Table 150).





Figure 11: Percent who agree Planning is done well in Cecil/ New Castle County

The proportion of respondents agreeing that planning is done well in their county has fallen from 47% to 37% overall, with New Castle residents accounting for the entirely of the drop. (Figure 11 and Table 106)

Figure 10: Percent of respondents familiar with WILMAPCO




Figure 12: Reasons for agreeing "Transportation is done well"



As shown above in Figure 12, those agreeing that planning is done well in their county point to functioning of public transportation elements (buses, trains, taxis), the road system working well, and their opinion that planners do an effective job.

Those that disagree with the statement (do not feel planning is done well – Figure 13) are most likely to mention extensive and slow construction, the public transportation system and heavy road congestion or traffic among their reasons.

It meets our roads needs, Route 1 got paved.

It seems okay to me but I really don't know.

It's going along pretty good, they're doing alright.

It's not horrible. The world can do a little better. Overall it's not that bad. I wish we had more metro/train stops.

I've not had a problem getting anywhere.

There is no problem.

We can get around just fine. We're rural out here.

Because although they may not have frequent scheduling the busses are punctual and the routes are accommodating in areas that people need to get to and going into amazon where people work and its as accommodating.

Because I think it's open to everyone, whether you drive, bike or take the bus. The bus system they have here is excellent and you can get everywhere.

Because I use a lot of the bus services, and have seen everything is good.

Because I've been here a while and I noticed the change in the bus routes, they got better at taking you places like the mall, it is easier. Helping people get access to their jobs got easier.

Because they have buses and Uber. Whatever way you want to go is out there.

Because you have Uber, different ways transport and encouraging taxi services, one or two down here in Wilmington, and Newark.

For myself and my friends who use the public transportation there hasn't any issues.

I get along as well as I do because I am able to go into town and go back home by bus.

I see the traffic but it's not by my area in Cecil County but just down Route 40. I see different buses and all.

I think the transportation company does a good job of connecting the buses to various places.

Most people are using public transit.

The buses are good.

The buses I see them run on Saturdays and Sundays. They make the transportation as easy as possible for people.

The buses make transportation available for the people that like to take them.

The people can use public transportation.

There's a lot of public buses. There's smaller buses that take people shopping and to the doctors.

They added more bus stops to certain areas.

They offer public transportation for people who need it and also medical transportation for doctor's appointments.

We have the train station here. People have a chance to take the train or walk to the train station, I don't see a lot of busses though.

Whenever I go and catch a bus it's right there.

Because I actually get the Wilmapco newsletters and I get communication from my community representative.

Because I am satisfied with our roads, environmental concerns, air and water quality being taken into account as it all ties up in transportation. I am active and did take into consideration

when I was told to have cement underneath the sidewalks so as not have the water run and pollute into Chesapeake, but instead have it to end up under tree which is a native species.

Because I know about them, I don't know about the ones in Delaware.

Because I know how much is going (research) into it and all the work that is required.

Because I think our roads conditions are okay, as well as it is easy to find information if I am looking for it. I like that they conduct surveys over the phone. Also, I like New Castle Community where there is access to give local input for your community at the community centers.

Because I'm always following the news and that's what I'm hearing.

Because just what I read from news, and internet, and I get the impression they are doing fairly well.

Because we have an excellent manager of community services who is responsible for mass transportation.

Because you have a man who is head of that (government) he was elected and is an extremely bright politician and is in charge of the county council (I cannot think of his name right now).

I have been informed of some of the things they are doing here. They are adding another exit between exit 100 and 93 in Perryville.

I haven't read it every time I got it but it made a lot of sense.

I know they put up billboards and signs when there's a new project and they do try and communicate with the community.

I met some of the folks that work in that department and seem to know what they are doing. They gave good presentations and their plans for the future.

I went to one Wilmapco meeting. They put in a lot of effort but I don't know what the outcome was.

Because I've seen quite a few improvements such as the widening of route 1, route 40, route 301 and ez pass.

Because they are keeping up with the roads, and also seen working on the bridges.

Because they are taking good care of our roads, and are not built a lot of things, and we still have our farms.

For what we do, the roads are always pretty driveable.

I can see what they're doing. When ever I go around I can see what's being done on the highway with construction.

I don't get frustrated by them doing work, they're doing a good job fixing potholes, the 301 bypass is well laid out.

I have not heard anybody my family say that they all drive, so it is pretty good. A couple even uses buses.

I have seen quite few roads being done pretty quickly and original I moved from New York, and where they are pretty slow in fixing roads.

I'm satisfied. Our roads are well kept and always working on them. They always have a project going on and they do a good job.

It seems the roads are maintained, and traffic flow seems to be good.

Other than the fact that road construction have been a big hindrance to traffic, the roads are better. The I-95 has been improved and Route 1 and the turnpike highway and other major roads have been better.

Other than the traffic I think they do a pretty good job of maintaining the roads.

Road systems are efficient.

Roads are better than in Wilmington, a better system. Maintenance of roads better in Cecil.

So far everything has gone well in terms of repairing the roads - especially the I95 and Route 1.

The road improvements that you're making seem to help. I just feel like what I'm seeing is effective.

The roads are good.

The roads are very good here, nice and wide, signals are very clear.

The roads are very well kept, monies have been invested, and they have put in more circles.

The roads that we travel are snow removal roads during emergencies. These roads are clear.

They are doing a pretty good job of extending the lanes on the highways and things like that. Making it easier to get around in certain areas. For example, what they did at the river front. You can cut through and not have to go around.

They are working on the roads now.

They do a good job. The roads are fairly well okay.

They do try to keep the roads up more than Delaware.

They put done new pipes and fixed all the roads with very little interruption.

They seem to be doing more for the roads. They repaving a bunch of different roads. They're making the round a bouts wider so the cars have more room to maneuver. Prior to that there were a lot of car crashes.

They're fixing 95. I live in the city and it affects the city more than the county.

We don't lay down a whole lot roads in the farmland. Take care of what we have.

Because I think they have a lot of good ideas for planning for parks and bicycle trails.

Because we have a lot of developments for parks and several areas in the community where you can walk, and also build more sidewalks and so they have been looking out for residents, for their dogs, and to get us to be healthy and to reduce us driving every where.

I think most of what I see as I travel around New Castle is projects that are adding bike lanes, and other infrastructure that will make it better for the residents of New Castle County.

Looks like thought being put into the right areas, like bike lanes, link cities by rail. Do more of that.

The work is done in some area and bicycling trail are good plan.

Because it seems like they're putting forward projects to improve congestion on major routes.

Because New Castle county covers a lot of areas, by having the planning staff get together and put all those brilliant minds together I think they can touch all the areas of the county. They can reach out to more communities.

Because someone is doing it, as things are being done.

Because they are doing a good job with it.

Because they are projects that are implemented that have had positive effects.

Because they're always doing construction.

First of all, the area is pretty well developed. That transportation was done years ago. The areas in the lower part of the county, there is quite a bit of planning and regulation.

Help the older people.

I feel if they are going to work on transportation in Delaware that maybe they're making the right choices.

I look around and I see what's going on. I have the impression that they city and county government are aware of the problems that this kind of work can help.

I think the projects are well thought out. The congestions is in certain areas like route 202. But for some people 1 and 95 are difficult are terrible for people commuting in the morning but I think they do plan well.

I think their planning is fine.

I think they are doing a pretty good job.

I think they do a pretty good job.

It's a progressive county and open to the public. If you need information, the county office helps. I find it easier here than other places.

The planning is very important, you always have to keep assessing the needs, the population growth and everything overall.

The projects I've seen have gone well and ended up with a good result.

The projects I've seen locally, have been largely beneficial.

They are doing a lot of work.

We have tons of projects is going on.

We're having things done here. They keep working on it. It has been an ongoing thing since the 60's.

Because if they continue on this current path now for about the last two years, it looks like improving.

Because it is better at this time.

I continue to see improvements and I see the input we give is being channeled to the appropriate people.

I do see some improvement but needs more.

I satisfy with updating process.

I see the improvements that I have made. I have lived here for many years.

It seems like we are making good progress. The highways are improving.

It's getting better.

I've been seeing improvements as I have been going in my neighbourhood with bicycle lanes and diagonal parking.

They are making improvement.

They do a lot of things to improve stuff.

We've had some improvements here, I see a bunch of long-term roadwork here, and they've made changes with trains and buses.

Because I'm familiar with the County's transportation plan.

From what I can see, the transportation system is adequate in the area with respect to getting to places such as Dover in Delaware.

I think the transportation system is pretty impressive. I like it: it's got trains and buses. The transportation is well managed.

It's fairly well done here if you compare it to Philadelphia. I drive 4 miles to the train station and then take the train to New York to work and then I go back on the train and take it back here and

drive 4 miles home and I spend all my money here. I'm the prime example and there are a lot of people here that do the same thing.

My family young enough to make use of transportation system.

Seems that they are attempting to improve the transportation in the county.

Some of the transportation is planned well, but there is still too much traffic.

They did just build transportation to the City but we need new buses.

They have good transportation and roads are good.

Transportation is good.

I can see the area where I live, the effort that's been made with traffic circles etc. to reduce congestion.

I don't think the traffic is all that bad in this end. There are not a lot of cars on the road and is not congested.

I would say the use of my personal transportation and the use of transportation by people I know.

There is no congestion in Cecil County.

There isn't much congestion.

They did build a new bridge and they widened it, so it's better for traffic. They put a light outside our development which was badly needed.

I've been on other states' roadways which aren't as good.

I've been on the roads almost everyday and I'm happy with what I see.

We're much better compared to Delaware because we have less red lights. Delaware has too many red lights.

I guess they are trying.

I guess they're trying to do the best they can. They do improve the roads in Cecil County.

I think they are doing the best that they can.

I think they are trying.

I think they do the best they can with the money they get.

They did they best they can.

They do what they can.

They know what they're doing.

They try hard to fix the issues that we have, although it is a very busy state. So many cars on the road and lots of traffic.

They try so hard and they more try they get more.

They're trying. Last few years started a bus system, railroad station reopening. A ways to go.

Because I think more required is public transit, bike lanes. Just too much congestion. Just needs common sense.

I do not know really, I have been in the state all my life. Because of some of their projects, some of them they take forever, a long time to do it or complete it.

I think we need public transportation around here.

Only because I think the density of population makes it difficult to do any kind of public transportation projects, and as a result whatever they've been trying to do does not seem to be happening. I think trains could be improved especially, connecting Philadelphia and Baltimore.

Only somewhat agree, lack of knowledge on planning and choosing projects.

Well, it could go either way. And when I go on the 272 leading to the 95. There is no red light here at the end of this road leading to a lot more congestion.

Well, the transportation that I see are people taking buses or are driving, but one sees less people on bicycling, though at Memorial drive was changed to accommodate bicycling and no one is using it. So wasting tax payers money, and they need to return back the road to the way it was as two lanes to and from each side.

Because I mean you just watch it where we live. In the area where we live we see it all the time.

Because it is needed.

I don't know if they make decisions or how they're made or if they're made well but the fact that they are reaching out for information to make more informed decisions is a good sign to me and therefore I'd rather lean towards the positive.

I took note while walking.

I trust them.

In my area, the transportation planning is all over.

It's fair.

Just because its a whole lot safer. A lot of people on and off the bus and there's a lot of people trying to get transportation.

Service I've experienced has been good, clear up downed trees done well and snow plowing exceptionally well done.

They have straighten Wilmington pretty good.

Because I don't know any other.

Because we need it.

I do agree although there are still a lot of things that need improvement.

I do not disagree. Not really involved with everything with that.

I don't take transportation.

I really do not know who decide and what they are doing, and how it is done.

I really wanted to say it's medium. Not great but not bad.

I'm not that familiar with it.

There's not much I can do about it.

Question 53: Why do you disagree with the statement "Transportation is done well in Cecil County/New Castle County?

Base on traffic and limited public transport from the suburbs to the city. Lack of full sidewalks for walking.

Because its chaos out there in the evenings during rush hour, it's almost grid lock out there.

Because I've seen nothing over the forty years I've lived here. Its congest and its red light after red light and the back roads are a mess.

Due to the 141 the traffic jam it's been years before they solve the problem there's more accidents. There needs to be an immediate plan to solve the problem for serious situations only, not waiting for four years.

I drive frequently, and I have always noticed that they are doing work on the same area over and over again, and it is more congested, and does not make the traffic flow safer anymore.

I guess when I'm in the car it seems that some of the traffic patterns are too congested. People aren't paying attention. It's not the planning commission fault, I guess it's that people aren't paying attention to what they're doing. I find that a lot of people driving now are not looking and paying attention to what they're supposed to be doing.

I sit in traffic. All kind of construction at all times.

I use to work south of 195, it is a cram in the morning and evening. 202 is always jammed.

I'm retired so I'm not out and about like I used to be. When I have to go out there's a lot of congestion everywhere and it seems to be with people working on the roads like on I95, on the main roads. Sometimes traffic is bad.

It's an over abundance of vehicles and not enough roads. Too much construction on the roads at one time.

Its just a mess, the roads are a mess too congested.

Just that traffic and the construction on the roads all the time, specially in Newport area. I have a sister who moved away ten years ago, and says each time she returns the roads are still under construction somewhere, never ends.

Lot of traffic and accident.

So many crash.

The traffic build up has gotten to the point that I don't think it was planned well.

The traffic congestion.

The traffic is getting worse.

There is always so much congestion and you can't even walk to some places because of it. I often think don't they ever plan it better?

There is too much congestion and again the trucks which goes back to the growth of the county.

They cause a lot of traffic issues and unfinished projects all the time.

They have created a disaster at huge intersections, so confusing. Too much traffic in one area coming from so many different directions.

Traffic jams by presidential planning of road trips not done well.

Traffic not organize.

Well, from my own experiences is that as I drive I notice it is on more congested roads, as more housing and developments are being built without taking into account the roads. With the now more influx of people moving to state and the roads are the last thing taken into consideration when it should be the first when planning housing or developments.

All the construction seems to be going on at the same time. How poor the major roads are. Even in the suburbs and rural areas.

Because the construction jobs are poorly planned, and so they block the roads for a longer time than was to be, and it becomes very difficult to get around.

Because there are a lot of projects yet for years to be finished, and are never done, and it just seems that the roads are never improved, and there is always some damage somewhere along on the roads. The roads that need to be improved liked the back roads and the narrow roads are not touched or rarely touched, while in the wealthy area roads are always being worked on and improved.

Because they close too many roads at the same time to repair them.

I wish they would hurry up and get done with route 7 and what ever it is that they're doing out here. It just seems like they open the road and then the next thing you know it's closed again. I just wish they would hurry up and get done with what ever they're doing out there and it's close to where I live. Everyday it's a different way that you can get out or you can't get out.

I'm ignorant of the planning stuff but I see where we are at. It might be better now. It's a disaster on I95 routinely. It's very poorly planned. We don't have decent train service to Philly or Newark that should be an easy well run service and it should be affordable.

It seems to me that there is a lot of inconvenience created by these projects that don't have a lot of prior warnings. Maybe it's a communication issue.

It seems what they're doing to me doesn't really have a plan in terms of road projects, closing roads at inopportune times.

It's like there's construction on all the different areas for entering the city. All happening at the same time.

Its overdone too much construction as it is.

Over the Hayden Bridge there was a difficult time. And an elderly lady had a beauty shop and she had to go out of her way to get home.

Primarily because there's a huge project on I95 that is taking two years. It causes massive backups in increased traffic and accidents almost everyday where the construction is occurring.

Roads and construction is all done at the same time.

Roads are always in construction, traffic and projects don't get finished.

Some many construction is going on.

Some of the projects have been going on for years, like 141. It hasn't been completed.

That's how I feel about it. It's not handled very well. Things that used to take two years to complete now take six years to complete.

The construction is non-stop and they take too long.

The frequency in which there are road blockages and it seems like it could be done better in terms of construction projects.

The many snafus in projects that I see. The long term process that goes on just to fix a two mile stretch of route 141 takes 2 years. If you got to do something lets not tie everybody up for so long.

The transportation planning should have less construction at the same time, and have other access roads available.

There is always construction happening. The 141 is always under construction.

There's always different road projects that cause congestion. Projects take too long.

There's too many projects that are being worked on at the same time affecting the same area.

There's too may road projects being worked on at the same time causing detours every 3 blocks. I'm sure they have their reasons but I wish they would work on one and then finish it and then work on another one.

They spent a lot of money on the 301 Bypass.

They will get numerous projects started that will go on and on instead of doing a project and sticking with it until they're done in a shorter period of time than six being done at the same time.

Things never get better. Instead of people stand around the constructions sites, have them do more. On the existing passenger and rail system, get more system to Newmark. The airport in New Castle County, encourage the airlines instead of discouraging the airlines.

Timing of traffic lights, overall congestion and construction, bad timing between construction projects.

Too many constructions and it's taking too long.

Too much road construction on I95, the highway is down to one lane. I don't believe that it was planned well. They also do construction to the beach in summer and not in the winter when it is not busy.

When they work on a road in New Castle County, it seems like it takes forever. It's not done in a timely fashion.

You picked a bad time to do construction on roads. I would have waited until after the holiday. It was already congested before and now it is worse.

Don't take care of the roads very well, too many tools especially bridge, should make bridge crossing available to walking and bicycling.

I just think long term planning and traffic range pattern planning does not take into account the heavy trucks causing road damages and traffic congestion. Especially in two areas in the county, it is really bad. I do not know what these trucks are paying in taxes, but I think they should be charged an extra fee.

I think our area is left out in terms or road repairs.

I think the construction is haphazard and seems to not last very long. The same roads are being repaired repeatedly.

Quality of roads and lack of bicycle and walking paths.

The roads are maintained well but if there's an accident, they just patch the roads.

The roads in Cecil County are horrible. It has speed bumps in it. The roads are weather warn. They take tanker trucks and put a brine solution on the roads it rusts out the underside of your vehicle and it eats up the asphalt on the roads.

They don't seem to be apt to the area where the roads are worse.

We needs more road fixing.

Base on the busing in the area and 15 minute drive it can take 2 hours on the bus, it non existing bussing, section 05 it cuts communities in half.

Because as I said earlier, they might be trying to improve things by this poll, they might be some improvements, but there is not enough public transportation, it is practical non existence in New Castle County, I call Delaware little California, because everyone is forced to get a car as there is no other option.

Because for starters I have a handicapped daughter and I have a handicapped and before I had a van we had to make appointments a month in advance to get her out anywhere.

Because from what I see and I experience it's just inefficient. It's a 25 minute drive but I could be on a bus for 2 hours.

Because I feel that there could be better public transportation and also there no buses on Sundays.

Because it lacks public transit well development or funded and vast improvements can be done. If we had iconic buses, good looking, nice rides and people would want to ride it. Or a local regional rail. I was born and raised here, and the buses were always having a reputation to be used by the poor due to lack of car ownership.

Because no trains.

Because the bus services are not wide enough or reliable enough and in this case if you want to take a bus to Wilmington, which is 6 miles away, in the morning there are a couple of buses that go there or if you want to go in the evening inhere are a couple of buses available but there's nothing in-between in the daytime.

Because there's no buses.

Because we have no transportation out here.

Better things to do like improve transit bus routes.

Bus wait time too long one person per car travel to school should be on buses instead of cars.

City residents do not have enough access to public transit and some new projects do not benefit the citizens.

I don't drive so I use the bus a lot. The buses go everywhere, but not often enough. I wonder why they don't have smaller buses. They have buses with 4 people on them. It would be more economic.

I feel it's only concerned with roads and there's little concern with trains.

I have been 20 years living here and there's no parking rides.

I have seen where they have re-structured how the buses run. This has been a problem for older folks. The older folks have had to walk more. There is no seating or shelters for the elderly.

I hear complaints constantly, people shot on the buses, I worked for 14 years as an inspector, a lot of business owner complaints about lack of safety on buses and other crimes.

I know a couple of people that take the buses and they tell me that they do not come often enough. I know with Chicago that they run all the time, every ten minutes.

I live in Chesapeake City Maryland, I have a medical practice in southern Cecil county. We cannot get public transit to come and get people from where I am down to Cecilton to a medical facility.

I live on a highway and there are, as far as I know, on my four corners there is no bus stop. We do have a problem with how long it takes the traffic light to change to get out of the development. It takes forever for the traffic light to change.

I think we need better busses and transportation. The operation of the busses.

In the area that I live in you can't catch a bus from here. You need to get an Uber or have a car.

It is not good there is a lot of improvement to do wit bikers bus improvements and a lot of traffic very poorly developed.

It seems like the area that I live in there's not much accessibility with public transit.

Lack of public transportation.

Lots improvement can be done like having more taxi.

More transportation on rural area to get to the store, Cecil county public health services should provide that.

Mostly because they don't address the issue of public transportation. If you're not on the main road you can't get a ride from the bus.

The bus downtown is inconvenient.

The bus systems is not good.

The buses are not on time. They drive past you. They do what they want to. Sometimes when you ask them to drop you off closer they say "NO", this is not the bus stop. I have a bad leg.

The public transit system should be more open to all residents, more flexibility with hours. The buses should run all-night.

There are really not a lot of modes of transportation. There is a lot of waiting for transportation to arrive.

There is no transportation other than cars.

There is not a lot of public transportation.

There's room for improvement, trains, more places for people to walk, we have no sidewalks.

They closed the train station in Elkton which is one of the major towns.

Trains I spent 3 hours on a train going nowhere.

We are not aware of what time the buses come, they need to put the bus schedules at the stops.

We don't have any public transportation.

We don't have any public transportation.

We have a bus in town, it will basically take you to Elkton I have to give them a three day notice to come out to my house. They will not come back to pick me up at 2:30pm or 3pm even if I have a 9am Doctors appointment and I have an oxygen tank.

Because we have been trying to get path ways for the last two years, and nothing has been done (Pike Creek and Mill Creek).

I don't see them doing any bicycle paths or anything.

I have concern for walking people and it's not safe and there is new exit on 95 is not safe because lots of trucks.

No bike lane, not enough buses.

There is a walkway from Wilmington to Old New Castle, I don't know how safe that is to walk in.

Because I do not see enough transportation going by.

Because I think more should be done.

Because I've been here for 32 years and nothing has been done here really. But Delaware does a great job.

I think it can be improved.

I think there should be more improvement.

It needs improvement. I don't think they're doing there best I think they can do better.

It never improves.

So many news businesses so many new residents and roads need improvement to keep up with population increase.

They can always do better.

You can always do more, do better.

Because I do not think it is done well. I think somethings are not thought properly when they are doing it.

Because I just do not feel that they are not taking comprehensive enough efforts to do it.

Because it's taken a very long time for changes that make sense to go through.

Because just not seen the results of clear planning. I could say route 40 corridor is total an example, their lack of planning or put in developments and all have one entry and one exit and dumps to route 40, the traffic is horrendous, and thus do not plan other ways for people to connect to other neighborhoods.

Because we are in Maryland so not done well, there is no coordination.

Could be improved.

I don't believe there's any commitment to doing anything except letting developers build wherever they want and have taxpayers keep up the roads. There's no comprehensive plan to keep development to the growth areas, the people in charge are the wrong people.

I don't think it's a very good transportation plan. We are all driving somewhere all the time. That is not what I am used to. I grew up with buses, subways and streetcars.

I don't think the planning is done very well when the Government is involved. It's about who is lining their pockets. They need to take politics out of it. The voters in the county should vote on what gets done, how much is being paid for. It should be based on quality work, the cheapest price and the quickest job.

I don't think there's a real plan for transportation in the county.

I don't think they've taken into account the pattern of growth when they have planned improvements to routes.

I feel like they focus on one thing at a time and aren't looking at the overall picture when it comes to transportation.

I had to work with Wilmapco because of my job and in public office. They propose pie in the sky stuff they're not realistic.

I think there's a lot of mistakes they have made. They put together projects without doing their homework on how it's going to affect people in the future.

I think we seem to be behind the trend. We are allowing communities to grow without adequate planning for traffic jams, we tend to do short term fixes on roads and can't ever get it fixed right one time. Lack of planning.

I would disagree I have not seen anything done.

It is improving but there's still a lot to improve.

It just doesn't seem they do it well, they don't think ahead.

It's almost like they don't plan at all.

Just based on what I've seen in the area I have not seen much effort put into the transportation system.

Just done haphazard, no indication any planning.

Mostly seems like all development happens around the route 40 corridor, and that's a nightmare.

Not keeping up with the building of the houses. It seems to be a mess.

Nothing is done right here. Things are not done effectively.

The planning is not the greatest and the execution is not good. I think they can do better. In all phases they can do better.

There are areas that need improvement.

There is no planning in the county.

There is none.

They are trying to make improvements on planning but they're still stuck in an eco system that caters to cars and they have to redo projects over and over again.

They don't do smart planning.

They don't plan anything.

Things are just chaotic.

When they know the population is growing they don't make a plan for that.

Because it's doing okay in my area, but it's not doing okay in the Wilmington area.

Because you'll see some places where it seems like money is being spent, and other areas where it isn't.

I just don't know. I drive to work and see some roads that get a lot of care compared to other roads that are terrible.

I think they serve certain people's need, their own needs, and the people's needs last.

It's not in the region I'm in. It's in higher population such as Paradell. Where there is trains and buses and sidewalks for biking.

It's not planned well. They are hoping Delaware become an electric car areas. Not focusing who can afford these cars, it's limited to a certain type of the population.

I've been to Wilmapco and they're just a bunch of people put together by heads of state to put together projects they want funded.

Money talks and planning walks. The plan is done by a select few that are controlled by the people with money and not the voters.

Some roads that actually need attention don't get it, congestion.

There's a lot of favouritism if you have the right name or enough money, you can get your project through even if the residents are against it. They favour people who are going to do the development/projects.

They allocate funds to the state reps who pick their projects. The money goes to the projects where people contribute to candidate re elections.

They fix stuff and sometimes they don't fix stuff.

When I see where construction is being performed I see it needed in other areas.

With the moving of the main bus terminal in Wilmington just to placade the big businesses so that bus riders and other people weren't seen downtown was really problematic, unfair and unjust. While I appreciate Wilmapco conducted a transportation justice survey I was disillusioned with results which showed that black and low income communities did not get projects prioritized nearly as often as white affluent communities.

Because they are trying to put Southfield in and 213 is only two lanes and you cant get down it on Fridays.

For one, on route 40 in northeast, over the years there have been many accidents that have included a number of deaths. They finally added a traffic light, however there is no turn signal if you want to go off route 40 onto the crossroads.

I do not like the new road that came to be known as Route 301 bypass. I also do not like the traffic circles on county roads and therefore do not agree with it too.

I don't really know if it's done well. They've change some streets to make a little better and they changes a little bit of parking but I don't like the style.

I live below the canal so they do not care about us even though I pay a lot of taxes. They're way behind in how they design the roads. They're 10 years behind because they take so long to design them that when they're ready to start they're 10 years behind. They do not plan for new developments and new schools when they're designing new roads.

I think there are stupid traffic circles for one thing and roads that need service are not getting it.

I use to sit on the technical advisory committee and the main road did not seem to be a priority in the overall scheme of things.

In my area, they put traffic circles, which cause more issues than helping. It seems so costly to have it done, in my area speaking for it there has been several accidents.

It has been the same road and same way since I was a child. We need to use the technology that we have now and needs to be used.

It makes no logical sense the way the transportation department improves our infrastructure e.g.: 195 South, 141 South/North.

The planning and engineering is bad and in the new roads and highways always something is wrong.

The roads and traffic, poor planning.

The single biggest error was the construction of route 1 with exits between Dover and Cristiano because It wasn't a true limited highway it became a suburban connector route. When they built it it was intended to be a limited access highway to improve transport Dover and Wilmington. But by putting all of the exits on it just increased development, sprawl and congestion along the route corridor.

There's not a lot of main roads, lots of back rural roads. Some roads are still dirt, and lots don't have the line down the centre.

They are not honest and truthful about the new 301 route, they lied to me.

They were planning to make a road but they didn't put in the new road. It was a plan made twenty years ago it was going to be an inside road off of route forty for local residents.

Too many 2 lane roads, weaving, slide into the other lane but there could be oncoming vehicle.

Too many houses not enough infrastructure, no shoulders, not looking out for me.

We need more roads and transportation systems.

Well, there is certain roads in Cecil county, improved in the last couple of years, but whoever there area others, every time there is rain, it floods again, roads are narrow. Cecil county becoming more congested, less rural, and something has to be done to improve roads.

Because all these public meetings happen in the middle of the day, when I am at work. They should make it available on Zoom or something, should have remote availability and access to all.

First of all the local county government do not let the community know when they are having meetings, I have not seen any signs or posters or in the news, do not let the community know how they are doing their doing stuff/decisions making or making us aware of when those meetings are being held.

For all of live in New Castle County, we should all know what is happening and how it is handled, as I have not heard or seen anything mailed or sent out, or heard of any meetings.

For one thing I don't know about it and if I look at what they have going it's not good.

I am not aware of the planning that is going on because of COVID. They used to have open houses and now they don't.

I do not know anything about it.

I do not know anything around here about anything, as there is no government outreach at all. For example, if there was a rail train development or project, people need to know about it.

I do not think they provide enough information to the residents of Cecil County. They have no idea what's going on.

I don't have enough info to say agree, don't want to agree to anything I don't know about.

I haven't heard too much about it. Right now what I don't see are a lot of charging stations. I see Tesla charging stations but not the other ones. If you buy a electric vehicle they give you an additional \$2500 on top of the federal.

I just feel there isn't much communication.

I work for the MVA and I know what they do.

It's car oriented.

It's hard and expensive to get across town. Getting form here to Newark is timely and expensive.

It's time schedule is not accurate. Everything is delayed.

Poor political infrastructure.

Appendix E: Survey Methodology

Interview Script Development

The original script for a WILMAPCO public opinion survey of residents of the region was developed in 2006. This same script was used again in 2010 and 2014, with the addition of a few questions. For the 2018 implementation, the script was put through an iterative revision process involving staff and stakeholder. The 2021/22 survey includes only minor changes to update the previous version. The interview script, in English and Spanish can be found in *Appendix F: Survey Script*.

Sample Selection

The target population for this survey was all adults 18 years of age or older who live in the two-county region served by WILMAPCO: Cecil County, Maryland and New Castle County, Delaware.



New Castle County's population represents a large majority of the total population of the two counties. As was done in previous waves of this survey, Cecil County was assigned 200 interviews to New Castle's 400, to ensure Cecil County had a large enough sample size to be statistically reliable for reporting on its own.

Sources for the Phone Numbers

The *survey sample* refers to the phone numbers selected to be dialed to invite residents to participate in the survey. The survey sample for this research was provided by Scientific Telephone Samples, of Foothill Ranch, CA.

The sample was composed of approximately 70% listed home (landline) phone numbers and 30% listed mobile (cell) phones. Where available, sample was selected to improve representativeness and complete quota cells by ethnicity and county.

Survey Administration

Interviewing, including pretesting was conducted between October 5, 2021 and January 27, 2022. On average, interview length was 20 minutes. The data were recorded electronically using a Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI) system. (CATI is a type of software program that automatically dials phone numbers, logs dispositions and records responses to completed interviews.) Interviews were attempted and conducted at different times of the evening and daytime, on weekdays and weekends to match respondent availability. A total of 38,045 phone numbers were dialed during the field period, yielding a final response rate was 5.9%. The dispositions of the numbers dialed during the survey are listed in the table on the following page.

Confidence Intervals

A purely random survey of 600 (the sample size for this research) would have a margin of error of about 4.1%, 19 times out of 20 (often described as being at a 95% confidence level). While this applies to results related to entire sample, the margin of error will be higher at the county level: about +/- 7% for the 200 completed interviews in Cecil County, and about +/- 5% for the 400 New Castle County interviews. Margin of error will be higher (less statistically reliable) when looking at results for smaller groups (e,g, age, income groups).

Data Weighting and Analysis

The demographic characteristics of the survey sample were compared to estimates published by Maryland Department of Planning (Population Projections 2021) and Delaware Population Consortium (Annual Projections, 2021) for Cecil County and New Castle County respectively, and were statistically adjusted to reflect the larger population. Additionally responses to the survey were weighted to the relative 18+ populations of the two counties. Harder-to-reach younger age cohorts were underrepresented in interviewing. Weights were applied to correct,

but were limited to avoid distortion resulting from high weights. The results of the weighting schemes are presented in the following tables.
