








Existing Conditions

- Previous planning efforts












Existing Conditions

- Remaining roadway network
















Pigeon Point Road Extended

Garasches Lane

- Direct Connection Between City of Wilmington Industrial Area and Port Area
- Potential Access to Heald Street
- Potential to Divert Trips from Southbridge
- Links Industrial Areas on Both Sides of Route 9
- Opportunities with Current DelDOT Bridge Project











Pyles Lane

- State Relocation of Residential Properties
- Possible Connection to Route 9
- Diverts Trips from Terminal Ave
- Adds Additional Truck Access
 Point to Route 9 Corridor














