PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM

To request the MDOT OPPPD request WILMAPCO to approve the following TIP amendment, upon WILMAPCO approval, notify the Federal Highway Administration - Maryland Division of the modification to two areawide projects in the WILMAPCO FY 2025 - FY 2028 TIP.

SUMMARY

The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) hereby requests WILMAPCO to amend the FY 2025-2028 WILMAPCO TIP to reflect the following actions.

TIP	PROJECT	PHASE	NEW FUNDING

ANALYSIS

Areawide Safety and Spot Improvements (WILMAPCO 3-4) — This requested amendment will add \$500,000 in state and federal funding for this areawide project currently funded for \$20,600,000; specifically, to the planning phase of FY 2025. This amendment will increase the total areawide cost to \$21,100,000. This funding increase is necessary to accommodate safety and spot improvement projects committed in FY 2025 as part of this areawide TIP project.

Areawide Urban Reconstruction (WILMAPCO 3-5) — This requested amendment will add \$1,900,000 in state and federal funding in the design phase of this project in the FY 2025-2028 TIP, including \$800,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2025, \$600,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2026, \$300,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2027, and \$200,000 in state and federal funding to the design phase of FY 2028, currently funded for \$1,380,000. This amendment will increase the total areawide cost to \$3,280,000. This funding increase is necessary to accommodate the design phase of an urban reconstruction project on MD 222 from 2,500 feet south of High Street to Mill Street (CE4661) as part of this areawide TIP program.

The attached STIP report documents MDOT's requested amendment with respect to funding for the above project. This requested action will not impact scheduling or funding availability for other projects in the current STIP, which remains fiscally constrained. The amended funding does not affect the portion of federal funding programmed for transit or allocations of state aid to local jurisdictions in lieu of federal aid. In addition, the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) remains fiscally constrained. The TTF supports State transportation system operation and maintenance, MDOT administration, debt service, and capital projects. Semiannually, MDOT updates revenues and expenditures using two national forecasting companies' latest economic estimates. The MDOT published funding details in the FY 2025-2030 Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP) and FY 2022-2025 Maryland STIP.
