







Passenger Rail




- Passenger rail stations along the Northeast Corridor have been improved
- DTC, MARC, SEPTA & NEC planning for new capital & service improvements
 Freight Rail
- Land use & zoning studies along freight rail corridors throughout DE
- Carload Express/Delmarva Central Railroad is growing freight rail service in DE
- Investments in infrastructure and intermodal facilities have been made
- Renewed focus on Port DE Container Terminal & freight-related econ. dev.
- Future decommissioning of Indian River Power Plant may change

FREIGHT RAIL TRENDS IN DELAWARE

In 2012...



- > ~2.8 million tons (4.0%) of freight was moved by **rail**, accounting for 23.0% of total ton-miles
- > ~57 million tons (78.4%) was moved by **truck**, accounting for 49.1% of total ton-miles
- By **2050**...
 - > ~13 million tons (11.9%) of freight will move by **rail**, accounting for 40.6% of total ton-miles

> ~78 million tons (71.7%) will move by **truck**, accounting for 38.3% of total ton-miles Source: Bureau of Transportation Statistics, Freight Analysis Framework Version 5.6.1


• Of the 297 miles of freight rail track in Delaware...

- > ~48% is operated by Carload Express/Delmarva Central Railroad
- > ~27% is operated by Norfolk Southern Corp.
- ~14% is operated by CSX Transportation
- > ~11% is operated by other small short-line railroads

KEY TAKEAWAYS

Challenges:

- Aging infrastructure/bridge
- Capacity limitations & bottlenecks
- Station improvements needed
- Land use/zoning conflicts
- At-grade highway-railroad crossings & low clearance bridges
- Competing needs along Northeast Corridor
- Funding

Opportunities:

- Modernize rail infrastructure, add capacity & enhance safety with new funding strategies/partnerships

- Explore & highlight where mode shift from roadways to rails offer the most benefits.




