Newark Bicycle Committee Draft Priority Recommendations from November Meeting

- 1. Implement short-term bike lane and sharrow recommendations as presented at the October meeting and discussed during the October and November meetings. Main Street and Delaware Avenue are particularly important. This list will also be part of the Newark Transportation Plan.
- 2. Get downtown bike racks installed.
- 3. Continue and build on the success of 2010 safety checkpoints in spring and fall 2011.
- 4. Continue participation in Newark Nite and Community Day.
- 5. Make 2011 Bike Month (May) and Bike-to-Work Day a special event in Newark, partnering with elected officials, DelDOT, Bike Delaware, the TMA, Downtown Newark Partnership, and potentially others. Arthur Wicks will look into the possibility of a race to accompany Bike Month in 2012.
- 6. Promote DelDOT's upcoming brochure on why sharrows are installed and how they work.
- 7. Provide comments and offer support for formal adoption of the Newark Transportation Plan. The Plan is expected to include recommendations for other items on the Committee's list such as a bike facility re-marking policy (partnership needed with DelDOT for long-line markings) and bike boxes.
- 8. Develop a formal Newark Bicycle Plan, either in WILMAPCO's FY 2012 Unified Planning Work Program or through volunteer efforts. The plan would include a bike parking plan as well as potential model ordinances. James suggested the plan focus on getting more women to cycle. Heather said that Portland has found bicycle boulevards to be particularly effective in doing so.
- 9. Possible action: advocate for and/or facilitate training for law enforcement and for planners and engineers.
- 10. Possible action: ensure the University of Delaware's redevelopment of the Chrysler assembly plant provides excellent facilities for bicyclists and pedestrians.
- 11. Other priorities?

Infrastructure

- Address the issue of providing a well marked western connection through town either by a two way bikeway on Delaware Ave or sharrows on Main Street
- Sharrows on Main Street
- Just like it took many years for the Pomeroy Trail to become a reality, we need to start planning for the next bike trail. If we don't ask for it, it won't happen.
- Main Street sharrows in early 2011.
- WILMAPCO will continue to collect/analyze crash data as we get new info from DelDOT.
 Easy thing to break out the Newark bike crash #s for tracking. Can include a breakout of bike volumes when we do future intersection counts.
- Revisit prior infrastructure plan by old Newark Bicycle Committee, decide on what to promote after the Pomeroy Trail construction begins.
- Need to establish facilities/infrastructure so people will be comfortable to ride first. You can educate and encourage people all they want but most people will not feel safe riding without dedicated bicycle facilities.
- Consider asking for separated bike paths on the main roads so people feel safer riding along with traffic. My non-biking friends consistently tell me that is main reason they don't ride more in Newark, even though they have bikes and may ride around their neighborhood for exercise.

Parking

- By downtown bike parking, I would like to see more bike racks in the lots behind the businesses on the north side of Main Street.
- Wherever possible we should ask for indoor or sheltered parking, such as all new apartments.

Education and Enforcement

- Education campaign through signage and possibly school newspaper for education the Student college population - wrong way riding!
- Place ad in Review: "Ride with Traffic"
- I think education classes for kids are great. But I think they should be goal oriented, i.e. they should be focused on riding between school and home, or between school and other likely destinations like Main Street. And it seems like there should be synergy between that and the Mayor's / elected ride. The elected officials ride should be oriented around kids bicycling in Newark (as opposed to a 40 mile ride with a bunch of Class A riders).

Encouragement

- Sponsor other bike events like family ride, community bike swap/fix, close main street (and perhaps other streets) for few hours to cars
- Bike Delaware is also considering a map for New Castle County (at least). We should be on the lookout for opportunities to collaborate with regard to maps.
- With regard to Mayor's/elected officials ride: include kids if possible. Lots of kids.
- Promote DelDOT's online bike map? Do they have one?
