






## **September 2022 Traffic Analysis: Street Closure Feasibility**

Traffic analysis found that there would be minimal impact to level of service if **two bridges were closed to traffic** and sections of **N**. **Adams** and **N**. Jackson Streets were reduced to one drive lane. Reducing N. Adams and N. Jackson to one lane and adding traffic calming measures slows traffic near Cool Spring Park, William Lewis Elementary, adjacent residences, and the proposed cap.




### **Potential Traffic Calming Measures**
